<p>HJC Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IDOH Health Issues and Challenges Grant</li> <li>• Healthy Start OB Navigation Grant</li> </ul>	Bethany Daugherty	<p>Bethany shared that the Physical Activity and Nutrition Workgroups will merge into one workgroup at the beginning of 2023. This merger will strengthen the two workgroups to collaborate on Health Issues and Challenges Grant projects. The Feeding the Community workgroup will remain a subgroup of the new Nutrition and Physical Activity workgroup.</p> <p>Schneck was awarded a Healthy Start Perinatal Navigation Grant. Leah Garrett, Registered Nurse, will be joining the Schneck OBGYN staff in late November as an OB Navigator. This role will help the most vulnerable OB patients get access to needed resources to improve health outcomes for mom and baby.</p> <p>Bethany share the 5 active grants workgroups and partners hold to address tobacco cessation, food insecurity, community navigation, nutrition, physical activity, chronic disease and maternal health.
